Paraprofessional Education Early Childhood

Students can complete the Paraprofessional Education Early Childhood program using one or more of the following delivery formats: traditional on-campus classes, online classes, and/or interactive video classes. Through online instruction, students anywhere can enroll and complete the program from any location.

DCB students have the option of taking classes collaboratively from other campuses in the ND University System, giving them many courses from which to select. DCB administers the registration, financial aid, billing, and transcripts for students using this option.

Why study paraprofessional education?

DCB's paraprofessional education early childhood major prepares individuals to work with children in a variety of settings including daycare centers, preschool programs, home childcare, and schools. Students learn to plan activities that promote the physical, cognitive, social, and psychological development of children.

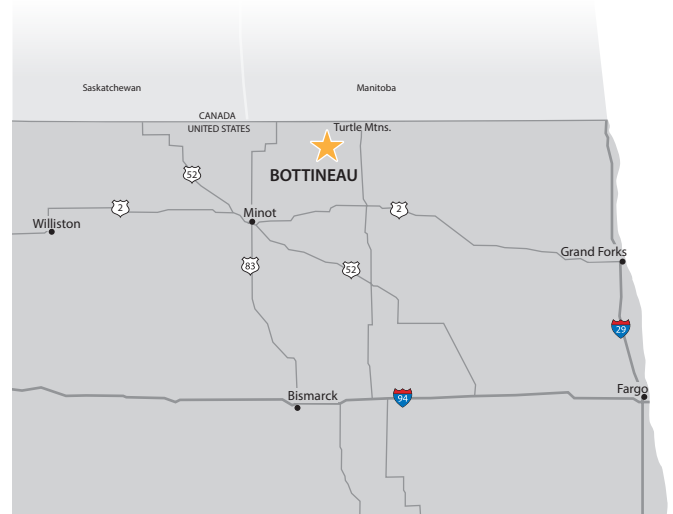
