# Information Technology

Information technology personnel possess computer and network support skills. Usually working under the supervision of an IT supervisor, they are responsible for troubleshooting, updating and maintaining computers and other technology devices. An IT person may provide direct customer or client desktop support.

Responsibilities may include: setting up desktop and server computers, installing and configuring operating systems, installing and configuring application and security software, and connecting electronic devices to the network. Other specific tasks may include: formatting hard drives, removing malicious software, relocating equipment, determining hardware compatibility, cabling, and making purchasing and maintenance recommendations to decision makers.

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
