Students in DCB's Associate of Arts (AA) in History program immerse themselves in the events, patterns and cycles that have produced our present world. This social science major will examine the cultural backgrounds, political movements, conflicts and technological developments humans have participated in across millennia. History is not simply the memorization of names, dates and facts, but rather a holistic understanding of the world that came before us.

Why study history?

The discipline of history allows students to better understand the world around them, no matter their future career path. Requirements for the Associate of Arts degree in History requires completion of the following classes: World Civilization, United States History, North Dakota History, World Regional Geography, History of Rock and Roll and International Politics/American Government. Graduates will also leave with the ability to utilize primary resources and construct thesis based written work.

Career choices

Graduates with an AA in History have many choices for future study and eventual careers. The study of history allows for a better understanding of current human systems in several different fields. Of course, many students of history desire to explore the world of teaching history or social studies, and this is a great first step. Graduates will have the necessary preparation to continue their education at a bachelors and graduate level. Examples of some paths that graduate may follow include:

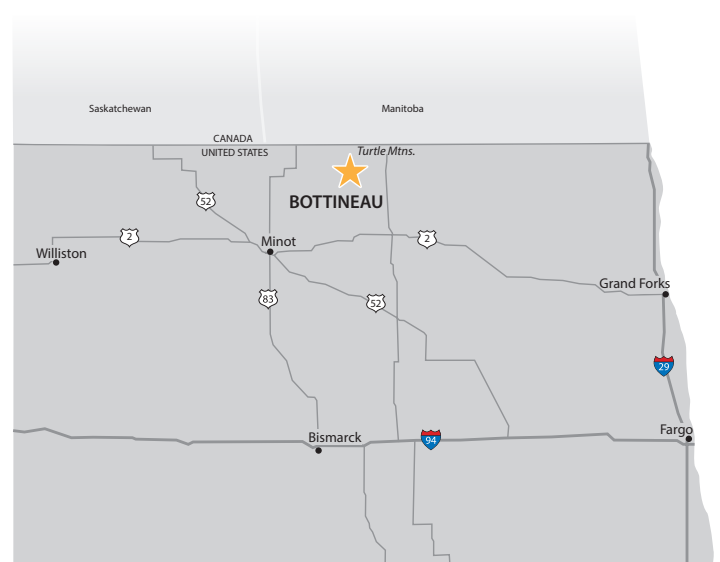
