The Dakota College at Bottineau **Associate of Arts (AA) in English** provides students with the basic general education background in communication, reading, and critical thinking to be successful in their academic and professional careers.

The program also provides creative writing and a variety of literature courses that allow students to expand analytical and writing horizons and/or transfer into a baccalaureate major in English. Most 200-level courses provide the basic general education requirements for Arts and Humanities and the beginning course requirements for an English degree.

Why study English?

Communication, creativity and critical thinking are essential in most personal and professional endeavors. An English major not only prepares graduates for specific careers such as teaching and writing, but also give them a broad based set of skills that are applicable in multiple career choices.

Career choices

Graduates with a degree in English may pursue a career in teaching and other writing based careers such as journalism, marketing, editing, and grant writing. An English degree also provides an excellent background for students pursuing graduate or law degrees.

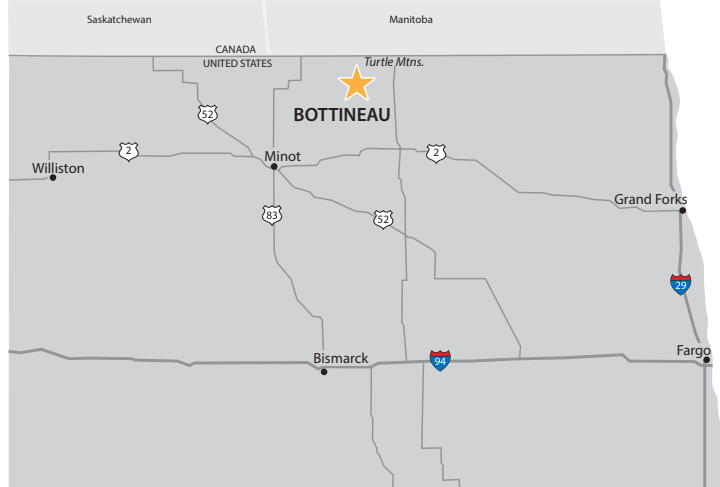
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DAKOTA COLLEGE AT BOTTINEAU VISION
