Course Objectives

It is expected that students will be able to:

- * Identify key terms, abbreviations, acronyms for various lab/diagnostic tests
- * Identify and describe commonly used blood tests/normal and abnormal results
- * Understand various body fluid tests used to diagnose diseases
- * Identify and understand commonly used radiographic studies with normal and abnormal results
- * Understand basic endoscopic studies/normal and abnormal results

Course Content

The following topics will be covered in this course:

- Abbreviations, acronyms, and key terms for various lab tests/procedures
- Introduction to Clinical Laboratory, Blood cell tests, Blood chemistry tests, and Coagulation studies
- Infectious disease and Immunodiagnostic blood tests, Urine and fecal

- studies, Culture and sensitivity tests, and Radiology studies
- Nuclear medicine studies, Endoscopy studies, and Ultrasound procedures

Work Expectations

Regular participation in the class is expected. In addition, students are expected to read the assigned chapters and complete the following graded work by the due dates:

- * Five (5) weekly graded assignments
- * Seven (7) weekly quizzes
- Two (2) group case study assignments: Students are encouraged to use the Discussion Forum to communicate with classmates to assist with organization of case study questions.
