# ANNUAL ENROLLMENT

Oct. 14 - Nov. 1

This is your annual opportunity to update your insurance benefit elections for 2025.

To update and review your benefit elections, log in to Member Self Service (MSS) <u>starting Monday</u>, <u>October 14</u>. The last day for you to make any changes to your insurance benefits is Friday, November 1.

What are the plan changes for

FlexComp Plan: The Medical Flexible Spending Account (FSA) limit increased to \$3,200.

**Dental Insurance:** Slight increase in monthly premium. <u>View rates</u>.

Health Insurance: Members enrolled in the High Deductible Health Plan (HDHP) with the Health Savings Account (HSA) have higher total IRS contribution limits, which are the sum of employee and employer contributions.

Single max: \$4,300Family max: 8,550

Age 55+ can continue to set aside an additional \$1,000 into their HSA Until enrollment day please review your Membership Log-in and personal information in preparation.

# **UPCOMING CHANGES TO LISTSERVE**

There will be an important update regarding messages sent to the NDUS Listserv from NDUS.edu addresses.

What to Expect: You can expect changes to the "From" address in emails, depending on where recipients read their messages. Some may notice a big change, like in Gmail, while others, such as those using newer versions of Outlook, may not see much difference. The new "From" address format will

include a message reference number instead of the traditional email address. If recipients use email filters or forwarding rules based on the "From" address, they may need to update those rules, as the new address could cause filters to stop working until adjusted. While the name displayed may remain the same, the actual email address will differ. This update will also improve overall email security, reducing the risk of spam and phishing attacks.

**Timeline:** NDUS-CTS plans to implement these changes October 22 -24, 2024, and will utilize the maintenance windows of 4 AM to 7 AM each day to test and apply changes.

#### Annual Security & Fire Safety Report 2023-2024



On September 30, 2024, Dakota College at Bottineau (DCB) posted the 2023-2024 Annual Security and Fire safety Report to our website. This report, which is commonly referred to as the Clery Report, requires campuses to collect, report and disseminate information about on-campus crimes to all faculty, staff and students from each previous year.
