This Thursday, the State Board of Higher Education (SBHE) is gathering in Bismarck for its monthly Board meeting. For Dakota College at Bottineau, actions will include notification of the passage of our two new certificate programs and finalization of our recent request for tier III

matching funds to support the Old Main project.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Today is the deadline for bill introduction at the legislature. So far, they are reviewing a total of 990 bills. The North Dakota University System (NDUS) is monitoring about 150 of these bills, and a few dozen could have significant, direct impact on us. Here are a few highlights:

- SB 2003 is the funding bill for NDUS. It is currently with the Senate Appropriations Education and Environment committee, where it will stay for the next several weeks. We provided testimony on the Dakota College at Bottineau portion of the bill on January 20th. The following day, there was a hearing on the Challenge Grant, which is contained within the
- SB 2274 would move the Farm Management Education program from the Department of Career and Technical Education to the Department of Agriculture and provide for a small increase in funding. This bill has a hearing in the Senate Agriculture and Veterans Affairs committee on Friday morning.
- HB 1437 is in the House Veterans & Government Affairs com-

mittee. It has not yet been scheduled for a hearing, but the proposal would eliminate tenure at two-year colleges in the NDUS beginning July 1, 2026. The Council of College Faculties (CCF) has a strong voice and is opposing this bill. SBHE will likely discuss and finalize their position this week on Thursday.

- HCR 3002 would have put a constitutional question on the ballot in the 2026 General Election to legalize professional and sports betting. The bill was opposed by NDUS. It was defeated last week on the House floor (70-24).
- HB 1161 was discussed last week by the House Education committee. It would create a centralized salary savings pool where funding for vacant positions would be held. The NDUS testified in opposition to the bill, and the Budget and Finance committee (SBHE) passed a resolution on Thursday to unanimously oppose the bill. The bill was supported and recommended with a Do-Pass vote by the Education committee. Last Friday, it was rereferred on the House floor to

- the House Appropriations committee for further deliberation.
- SB 2242 will be heard this week in the Senate Education committee. It is a bill to establish a legislative management study of the institutions of higher education including the potential consolidation of colleges and universities.
- HB 1221 was in the House Education committee and is now in House Appropriations. It would provide \$24M to the SBHE for workforce education grants. These funds would be used to support the costs of initiating new programs. NDUS testified in support of this bill.
- HB 1064 is in the House Education committee and was introduced at the request of SBHE.
 It requests some changes regarding the authorization of external, distance-based higher education entities wanting to operate within North Dakota.
- SB 2212 is in the Senate Appropriations Education & Environment division. This bill would significantly enhance capital building funds for higher education. NDUS testified in support of this bill.

If you need to reset your password, select "Forgot my password". Please note if you have difficulty resetting your password, your DCB IT contact is Jacob Nelson, 228-5429 OR Jacob.p.nelson@dakotacollege.edu

Once you have successfully logged into the Employee Self-Service system (If Employee Self Service

does not display in the upper left

corner, click on the name of the page listed there and select Employee Self Service from the dropdown.)

- Click on the Payroll tile.
- Click on the W-2/W-2c Forms tile.
- Click on View Form under Year End Form
- If PDF W-2 form does not appear, please check to make sure your browser is not set to block PDF forms.
- W-2 Form can be viewed, saved, printed, or you can return at later date/time to get a copy. To view W-2 from another year, change the tax year at the top of the page.

If you did not receive your W-2 in the mail, please verify your current address is accurate in People Soft. Log into Employee Self-Service.

- Click on Personal Details tile
- Click on Addresses tile
- Review your addresses. If an address needs to be changed, simply click on the address.
- Make the appropriate changes to all addresses needed.
- Once complete, click the Address Validation Button at the top of the box. This will validate the address you entered with the US Postal Service.
- If the suggested address is definitely not your address, click reject and re-enter your address. Repeat above step.
- If the suggested address (according to the US Postal Service is accurate, click the Save button in the upper righthand corner of the box.

This will provide an update moving forward. You will need to access this year's W-2 from the electronic version above.
