Hope you enjoy reading this brief update ...

Last week, the State Board of Higher Education (SBHE) adopted the

adjustments we requested in mandatory student fees. As a reminder, we are increasing fees by \$1.88 per credit hour. The food costs that are passed on to us by Sodexo are also being incorporated into board plans. The cost for a double-occupancy room with a 15-meal plan will increase by \$190 per year at DCB. Only four institutions (Lake Region State College (LRSC), Mayville State University, North Dakota State College of Science, and Valley City State University) have lower comparative costs, with LRSC being only \$8 less per year.

On Friday, April 4, President Shirley and I will be visiting with the House Appropriations, Environment and Education committee again. The committee is focused on our joint request to purchase Health Center

West in Minot. It's my understanding that they may also be interested in learning details about our Dining Services and Housing budgets as part of our request for a new Residence Hall. During this conversation, we could have a chance to highlight the new "roster fee" that will be charged to student-athletes this fall. The \$150 per semester per sport fee will generate about \$36,000 per year, which will assist us in supporting athletic travel and lessen the impact of athletics on our housing revenue.

The Strategic Planning and Institutional Council of Effectiveness (SPICE) met in March and assembled a draft implementation plan for institutional actions to be undertaken during the next academic year. This list of actionable items was generated from the two surveys conducted recently—so thank you for your participation. The draft is under review by our Senates, so please provide feedback as the opportunity arises. Our goal is


to have a plan ready in time for work to begin this summer.

On a personal note, while it was certainly an honor for me to have been under serious consideration to lead Dickinson State University, in the end it was simply not to be. The outpouring of emotion from you throughout the process has been humbling. It's a joy to be staying at a place that I have grown to love, and I am more convinced than ever that remaining in Bottineau is right for me. 
