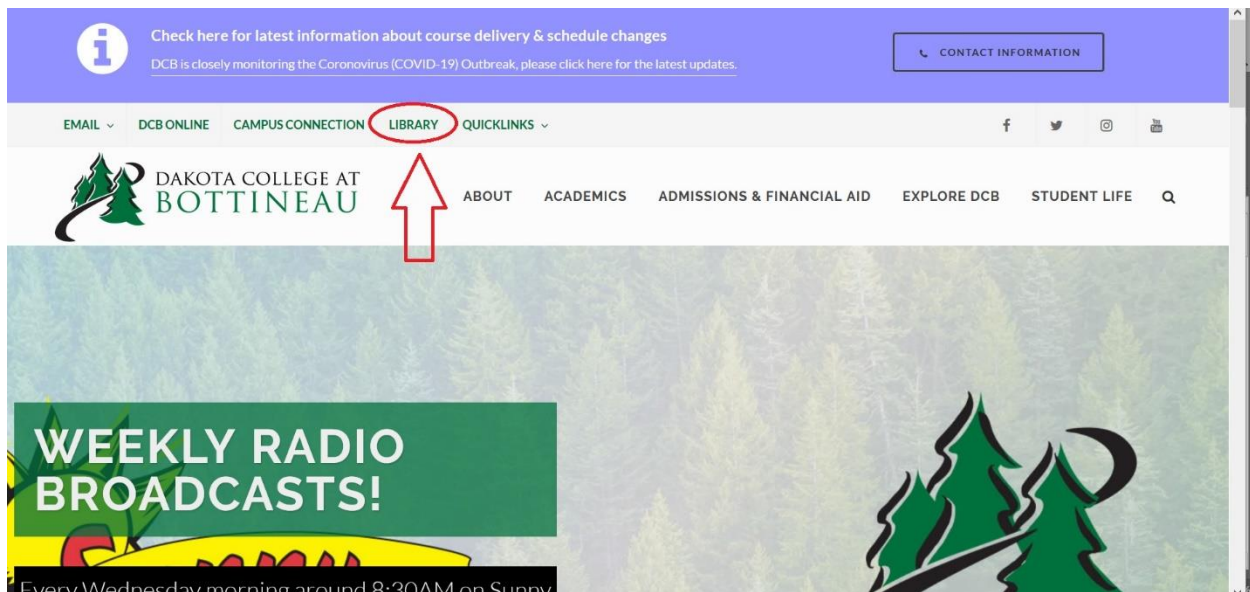


Hello DCB students and welcome to the wonders of online library research!

Please follow the instructions below to see how to access DCB Online Library Resources such as *Films on Demand*, as well as the online journal databases *EBSCO Academic Search Premier* and *JSTOR*.

1. To begin, you will need to know your student number, sometimes referred to as your EMPL ID number. If you do not know this number, check your student ID, contact student services or a librarian. DCB Library has two full-time librarians. Contact information is below:

5. Continue scrolling down on this page and you will see categories to the left. As you move down, go to Journals and Magazines. This is where you will find the majority of databases for general searching. (Browse this page and take a look at the other categories, too! The "Nursing" section can be especially helpful.) To begin, we will take a look at EBSCO Academic Search Premier, followed by JSTOR. These are the two most commonly used options available. See screenshot below:


