CATALOG COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is designed to give the student a practical approach to the layout and configuration of the Microsoft Windows Server environment. The goal with this class is not only to aid in the MCITP certification but to also make use of the skills acquired in the previous courses that are offered.
