



Tuberculosis Screening Form

All students born outside of the U.S. are required to fill out the Tuberculosis (TB) Screening Form and return it to Student Services

If you answer yes to any of the questions in Part B, Mantoux skin testing, a T-Spot or Quantiferon Gold blood test is required. Documentation of results from a physician must be obtained prior to admissions being complete. If you have tested positive, documentation of a negative chest x-ray will be needed. All students with a current positive test result must have doctor's recommendation for treatment. If you answered "None of the following apply" then you do not need to do TB testing.

- Contact with a person known to have active TB
- Signs or symptoms of active TB such as chronic cough, bloody sputum, fever, night sweats or weight loss

- History of illicit drug use
- Have been diagnosed with a chronic medical condition that may impair your immune system:

If any of the above do apply, TB testing is required:

- Provide documentation of TB testing within the past 6 months by a healthcare provider. PPD Mantoux skin test and documentation in millimeters of induration or TB serology testing results. A chest x-ray will be required for anyone with a positive test. A negative chest x-ray is not a substitute for a TB test.
- OR
- Provide documentation of prior treatment of active TB disease.
