

**MaSU RN to BSN Program Requirements  
taken at MaSU once transfer from DCB**

**Baccalaureate Degree Requirements**

A minimum of 120 SH credits are required by Mayville State University to earn a baccalaureate degree.

- Minimum of 60 SH credits awarded for completion of nursing degree leading to RN licensure from a regionally accredited institution.
  - Must meet MSU Essential Studies (General Education) requirements
  - Other credits, including essential studies courses, may transfer from prior degrees or additional approved course work
  - Students must earn a minimum of 30 SH credits from MSU to meet the residency requirement
- Minimum of 36 SH upper division (300/400 level) credits required.
  - 28 SH credits RN-to-BSN core courses
  - 8 SH credits upper division non-nursing courses
    - 3 SH credits statistics course (300 level at MaSU)
      - Transfer credit substitution of equivalent statistics course upon approval, however, must still meet 36 SH 300/400 level credit requirement.
    - 5 SH credits elective courses

Credits in the PN/AD program: 46 Nursing, 27 General Education = **73 Total** (18 Clinical credits in PN/AD program)

Credits after AAS RN licensure eligibility = Completion of 12 credits at either 2 year Institution or MaSU, 28 credit BS Nursing, 8 credits at 300/400 MaSU level (includes 3 credit statistics course) = **48 credits**

Total credits = **73 (AAS) + 48 (post AAS - BSN) = 121 minimum credits** including transfer, essential studies, upper division, and nursing program credits
