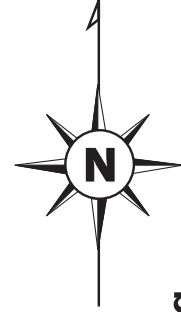

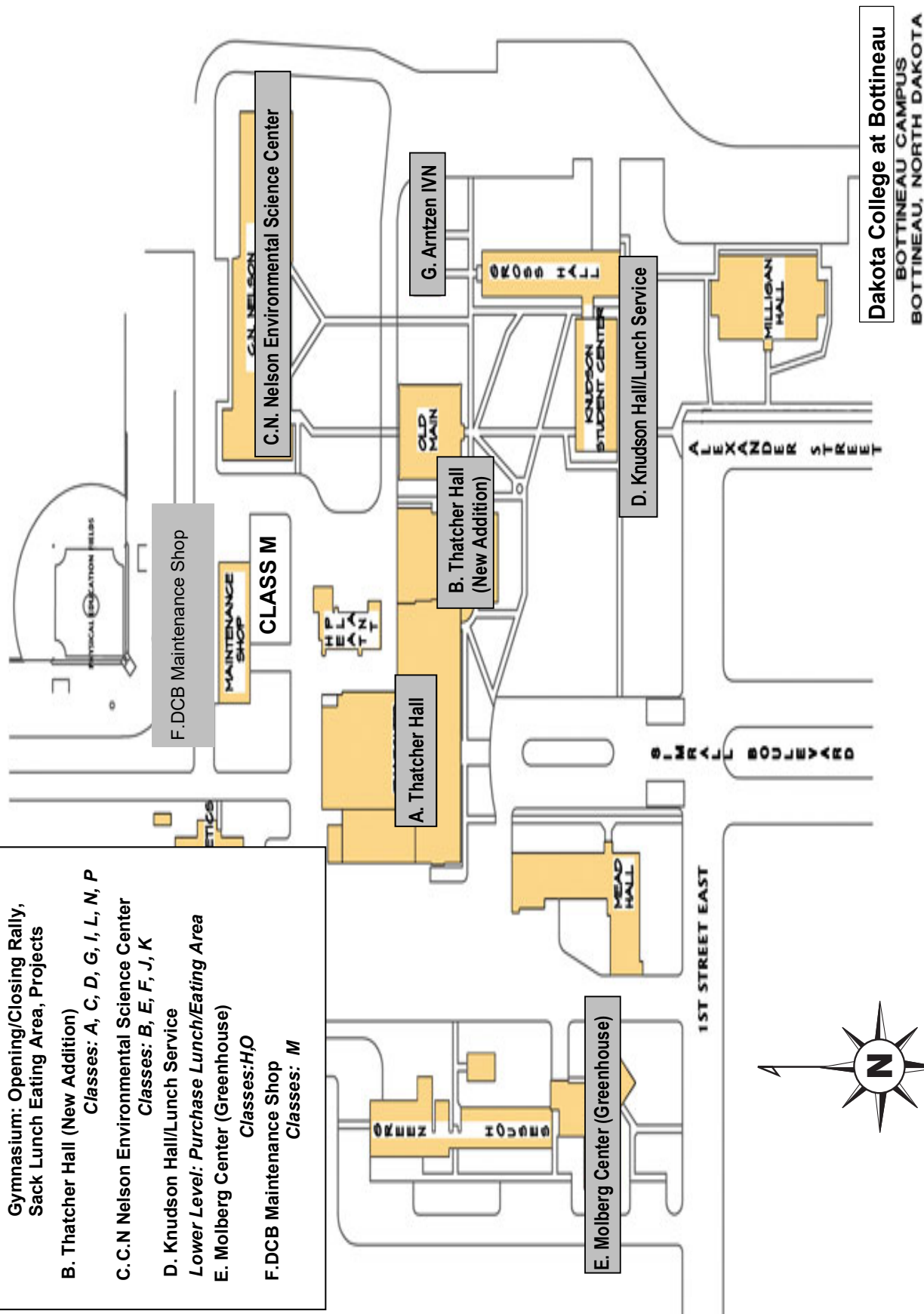

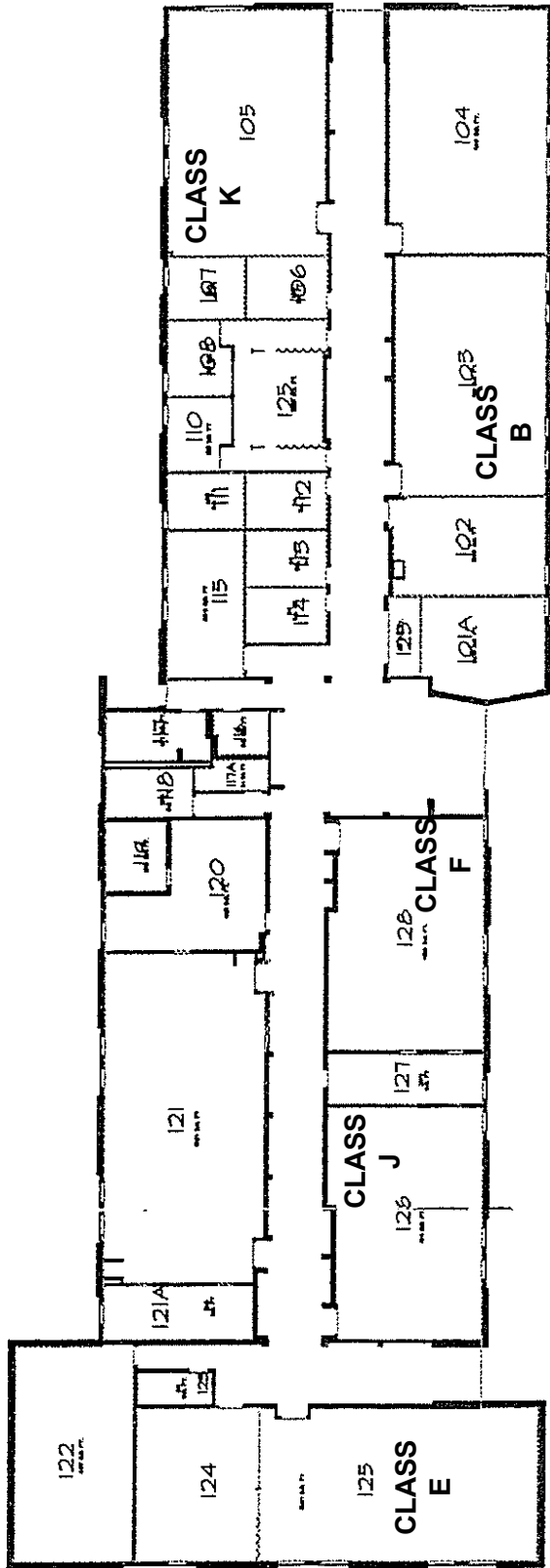

CLASSROOM MAP

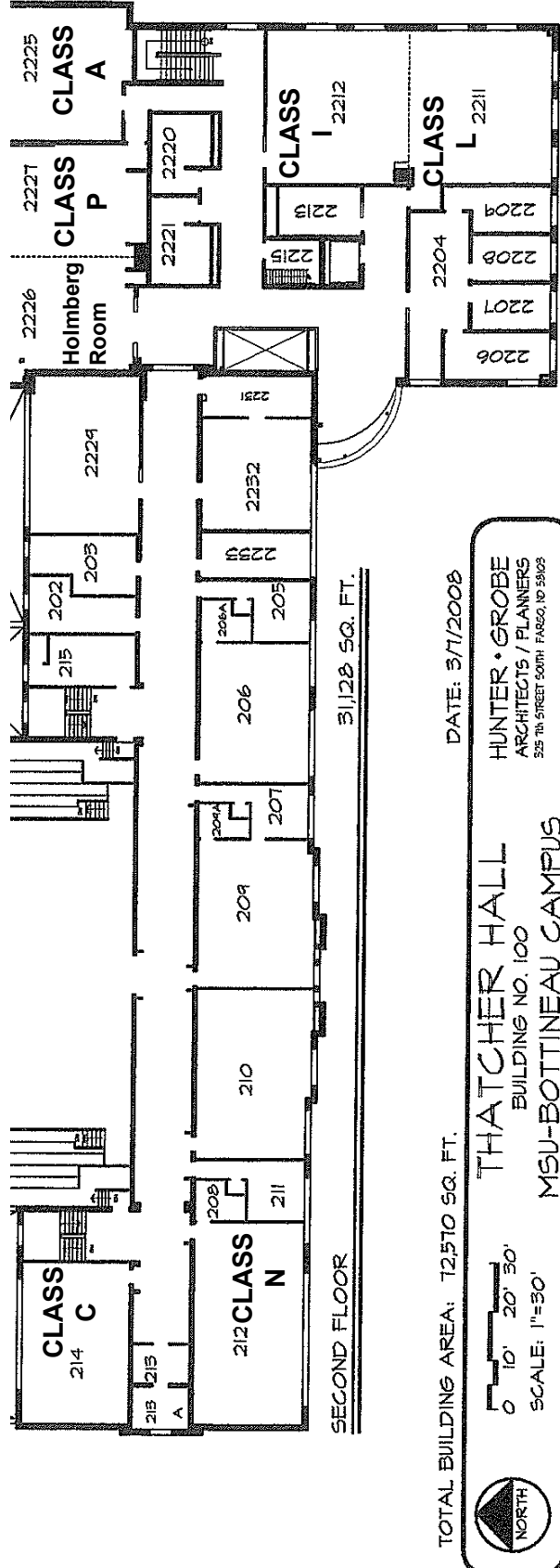

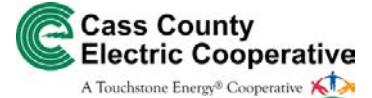
